About Autism

Autism is a general term used to describe a group of complex developmental brain disorders – autism spectrum disorders – caused by a combination of genes and environmental influences.

These disorders are characterized, in varying degrees, by communication difficulties, social and behavioral challenges, as well as repetitive behaviors.

Our Mission

We are dedicated to funding global biomedical research into the causes, prevention, treatments and a possible cure for autism. Dear Friends,

The great French writer Victor Hugo once said: "Perseverance, secret of all triumphs." That quote describes not only 2013, but our entire nine years working for our loved ones with autism. We persevere, and we are transforming the most pressing developmental disorder of our time.

From Malaysia to Luxembourg, Antarctica to Chile, our awareness campaign is reaching every corner of the globe. During Autism Awareness month, more than 8400 monuments, landmarks, buildings, churches, synagogues, temples, schools and homes on every continent were lit blue in honor of the 70 million people with autism worldwide. Our media presence grew enormously. More than 750 national and local media outlets covered the Light It Up Blue 2013 campaign, which led to nearly 120,000,000 print and broadcast media impressions.

As we continue to raise awareness and educate, we are seeing unprecedented cooperation on the world stage. In May, the Executive Committee of the World Health Assembly passed a draft resolution on autism spectrum disorders. And just a few months later, in September, our Global Autism Public Health Initiative (GAPH) partnered with the World Health Organization to support the first ever global conference on autism in Geneva, Switzerland. In New York meanwhile, princesses, ambassadors and dignitaries gathered for the Sixth Annual World Focus on Autism. There we honored Mrs. Ban Soon-taek, the wife of United Nations Secretary General, Ban Ki-moon, for her service to our community.



Increased awareness naturally assists our advocacy efforts, and this year our advocates here at home took every statehouse and the nation's capital by storm. In November, we held our first "Autism Speaks to Washington" summit with congressional leaders and hundreds of advocates and announced the results of the first National Housing and Residential Supports Survey on what our community needs in the immediate future. The weekend culminated in more than 250 advocates marching on the Capitol and delivering petitions to every member of the

House and Senate, demanding a national autism plan. The momentum following the summit was exceptional. One-by-one, members of both parties joined the congressional Autism Caucus and stepped forward to support the ABLE Act. We saluted two more states, Minnesota and Oregon, for enacting autism insurance reform in 2013, raising the total to 34 states.

From our incredible LIUB sponsors and their restaurant and in-store programs to our outstanding special events at iconic locales such as Winged Foot, Baltusrol, and the Metropolitan Museum, we continued to make autism a household word. We touched hearts, and

as a result, the ripple of our pebble was felt far beyond our family pond and well into the oceans of the world's consciousness.

Friends, 2013 was a busy and fruitful year. It reminds us of a quote from legendary baseball player Babe Ruth: "It's hard to beat a person who never gives up." We will never give up. They are our loved ones. Our children. Our grandchildren. Our nephews, nieces, friends and neighbors. They are the future, and so we will work day and night in 2014 on behalf of everyone with autism.

Letter from the President

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

There is only one way to describe 2013 — it was an exceptional year. Hard work, determination, good will and profound accomplishment left us poised to launch major initiatives in 2014. Near record fundraising of \$70 million from walkers, corporate partners, major donors and supporters across the globe allowed us to fund more research and meet the needs of more families than ever before.

Under the leadership of **Chief Science Officer Rob Ring**, our science team had a watershed year. The first report from our **AUT10K Genomes Project** was released documenting genetic change in half of the 32 families sequenced. Recognizing the potential role of the environment and other biological systems on gene expression, we began to study the epigenetics of autism. And at the same time, we launched a major push to get children diagnosed and into treatment at much younger ages. Our **Early Access to Care** outreach campaign focused on breaking down cultural and socio-economic barriers to diagnosis and treatment. We held our **First Annual Autism Investment Conference** which brought leaders from the diverse worlds of science and business together to discuss innovative ideas for product development in the areas of diagnostics, therapeutics, medicines and technology.

Our **Family Services** team across the country continued to support autism families each day with information, advice and easy-to-use tool kits. Our commitment to addressing the unmet needs of the adult autism community was strong and growing. Thanks to the generosity of a long time donor, we held nine town hall meetings around the country aimed at connecting small businesses interested in employing adults with autism with already successful business models. Autism Speaks awarded nearly \$250,000 dollars in post-secondary school scholarships, and for the holidays we surprised 800 less privileged individuals in our community with the gift of an iPad. Technology has opened up a world of opportunity for many on the autism spectrum who struggle with communication deficits. With over 30,000 calls to our **Autism Response Team** hotline, we experienced the urgency of our mission every single day.

Autism Speaks state and federal advocacy efforts came together in our first ever **“Autism Speaks to Washington” Summit** in November. Over two hundred and fifty leading advocates convened in the nation's capital to urge Congress and the Administration to support a national strategy for autism. During a class “Hill Day” the group delivered over 150,000 petitions to Members of Congress, urging that autism be a national public health priority.

Succeeding in our mission “to improve the lives and futures of those affected by autism” would not be possible without tremendous financial support. Our top sponsors, the **TJX Companies, Dollar General, Toys R Us, Joe’s Crabshack, White Castle, Modell’s, Shop-Rite-Village Super Markets** and **Sprouts Farmers Markets** were with us every step of the way raising money and awareness through in-store campaigns and restaurant promotions. Their compassion led to revenue-raising innovation which in turn led to progress on the ground, and most importantly, in the homes of our families. We owe special thanks to benevolent donors including the **Allerton Foundation, the Mel Karmazin Foundation, the Stavros Niarchos Foundation, Royal Arch Research Assistance, and the Estate of Charles C. Meixner**. We are grateful to the many celebrities and athletes, as well as **Major League Baseball, the NFL, and the NBA** for their commitment to our mission. Thanks to the passion of our staff and countless volunteers in every town in America we are working on behalf of our autism community faster than ever before.

At Autism Speaks, we are moving forward every second of every day. The three million children, teens and adults with autism in America are counting on us.

Autism Speaks Ten Thousand Genomes Program (AUT10K)

The Autism Speaks historic AUT10K program published its inaugural report in the *American Journal of Human Genetics*. The report focused on the whole genome sequencing of 32 families and identified autism-linked gene changes in half of them. This more than doubled the success rate of standard genetic testing for autism. The study also identified several new autism-linked genes and provided important medical insights for the participating families. At the same time, the AUT10K project continued its rapid progress toward the historic whole-genome sequencing of 10,000 individuals affected by autism and their families. This unprecedented genome library promises to guide the development of diagnosis and personalized treatments based on genetic profiles.



First Annual Autism Speaks Autism Investment Conference

Taking place in New York City, our inaugural investment conference drew more than a hundred entrepreneurs, investors, business executives and researchers for the world's first conference on investment and product development in the field of autism services and therapies. "From healthcare to education to housing, addressing the diverse unmet needs of the autism community can only be tackled with strong engagement by the for-profit sector," said Autism Speaks Chief Science Officer Robert Ring. Building on the success of this first conference, Autism Speaks expanded plans for its second annual Autism Investment Conference in San Francisco, May 4 and 5, 2014.

The mission of Autism Speaks Research program is to improve lives today and transform lives tomorrow. Since its founding, Autism Speaks has invested more than \$200 million in scientific studies and strategic resources for autism research. In 2013, Autism Speaks invested more than \$16 million in research aimed at improving diagnosis, prevention, treatment and lifelong support for individuals and families affected by autism.



Epigenetics of Autism

Autism Speaks helped open a new field of research with the first large study on the role of epigenetics in the development of autism.

Epigenetics refers to biological systems that control the expression or activity of genes without changing their underlying DNA code. Environmental influences – including exposure to toxic chemicals – are known to affect the epigenetic control of gene expression. In the groundbreaking study, funded by Autism Speaks, researchers documented tell-tale epigenetic patterns between identical twins who differ in autism traits. (Identical twins share largely identical DNA.) The researchers linked distinctive epigenetic patterns to autism diagnosis, related behavior traits and severity of symptoms. The differences appeared in regions of the genome associated with early brain development.

Autism Speaks Partners with the World Health Organization

Autism Speaks co-sponsored the World Health Organization's first international conference on autism. The Geneva meeting represented the first step in enacting the **World Health Assembly Resolution on Autism**. Autism Speaks Senior Vice President for Scientific Affairs, Andy Shih, opened the conference with a call to action on improving access to autism services worldwide, with an emphasis on underserved regions.

The Autism Speaks Early Access to Care Initiative

Launched in 2013, the initiative's mission is to reduce the average age of autism diagnosis and increase access to high-quality early intervention in underserved communities across North America. EAC's inaugural year included major outreach projects with the *New York City Korean Community* and the *National Black Churches Initiative*. In the service of earlier diagnosis and intervention, Autism Speaks also launched an updated online version of the **M-CHAT-R** toddler autism screening tool on its website. Each week, more than 2,000 parents use this tool free of charge. The results of this online screening tool guide parents to appropriate services.

Self-Funded Employer Tool Kit

Many families and individuals with autism are unable to access autism insurance benefits because their employers self-insure their health plans, which are exempt under federal law from providing autism benefits. Using the **Self-Funded Employer Tool Kit**, Autism Speaks works with advocates to convince major employers to voluntarily add autism-related benefits to their health plans. In 2013, *JPMorgan Chase, GM, Chrysler, United Technologies, Credit Suisse* and *Qualcomm* were among the major employers to voluntarily add autism coverage.

Autism Insurance Reform

Minnesota and Oregon plus the District of Columbia enacted autism insurance reform laws during 2013 thanks in large part to Autism Speaks' advocacy efforts, raising the nationwide total to 34 states. In addition, California, Massachusetts, New Mexico and Texas all amended their existing laws to provide even stronger coverage.

Autism Speaks Insurance Link

To help guide families and individuals with autism through the maze of state and federal laws governing health insurance, Autism Speaks introduced the online **Autism Speaks Insurance Link**. The web-based program leads users through a series of questions to determine what coverages their policies may provide, depending on their type of coverage and what state they live in.

As new health insurance options became available to millions of Americans as a result of the *Affordable Care Act*, Autism Speaks created web resources explaining the autism-specific aspects of the law. The site attracted over 45,000 visits.

Working with Military Families

Autism Speaks worked with military families and our allies in Congress to discourage TRICARE, the Department of Defense health insurance program, from implementing potentially harmful changes to its coverage for applied behavior analysis (ABA) therapy. We continue to work with service members to reform TRICARE to provide the best autism treatments available to the most military families.

Autism Votes is the advocacy initiative of Autism Speaks. Its focus is two-fold:

- 1.) Maximizing support and funding for autism research, surveillance, awareness and services, and
- 2.) Working in Congress, state capitals and the courts for autism insurance reform that maximizes coverage for evidence-based treatments, including behavioral health.

SERVICES

New Tool Kits

Four new tool kits were launched in 2013. The **Advocacy Tool Kit** aims to help individuals and their families develop and use critical advocacy skills in order to achieve the best possible outcomes. **Leading the Way: Autism-Friendly Youth Organizations** is a guide for organizations to ensure that youth with autism have the same formative experiences through community programs that are available to their peers. The **Postsecondary Educational Opportunities Guide** was created to help individuals with autism and their families explore the different opportunities and learning environments available after high school. The **Employment Tool Kit** contains a wealth of information and tools to help adults with autism research, find and retain employment in the competitive labor market.

New Grant Programs

New grant programs announced in 2013 included the **Brian & Patricia Kelly Postsecondary Educational Scholarship Fund** as well as **Regional and Neighborhood Grant** programs, which were an expansion of 2012's inaugural **Chapter Grant** program. Through the **Kelly Fund**, \$249,000 was awarded to 11 colleges, as well as vocational and transition programs to provide scholarships to financially disadvantaged individuals with autism. A total of \$700,000 was distributed to 141 local organizations through the three local grant programs, as well as \$343,000 to 15 recipients through the annual **Community Grants** program. In addition, 800 iPads were awarded to financially disadvantaged individuals and schools in 48 states.

Family Services is committed to connecting with and empowering individuals with autism and their families through resources to improve their quality of life today and in the future.



The Autism Response Team

In 2013, the **Autism Response Team** continued to respond to families and individuals in the autism community in order to connect them with resources and provide them with tools and information. The team had over 30,700 phone calls and emails this year, including over 1,000 in Spanish.

FAMILY

Advancing the Role of Small Businesses

Through a new initiative funded by a generous grant from the *Ireland Family Foundation*, **Advancing the Role and Impact of Small Businesses in Employing Adults with Autism**, we worked collaboratively with *Extraordinary Ventures* to host nine town halls across the country. This action was designed to engage the community in a dynamic discussion about employing adults on the spectrum and highlighting best practices. More than 1,000 individuals with autism, family members, small business owners, employment service providers and government agencies participated in the town halls.

National Housing

The **National Housing and Residential Supports Survey**, released in July to quantify and characterize the current housing and residential support needs of individuals with autism across the country, had more than 10,700 respondents, including many from individuals with autism. The results were announced at the **Autism Speaks to Washington Summit** in November. Our hope is that these results will help promote public and private sector support to better meet the unique needs of adults with autism.

REVIEWS

National

Since 2006, Autism Speaks has partnered with the Ad Council on our "Learn the Signs" PSA campaign. The PSAs appear in print and television with advertising entirely donated by the media. The PSAs have also earned numerous awards, including an *Effie Award* for advertising effectiveness in 2008, a *Silver Telly* in 2009, as well as a *Silver Addy* and *Gold Ogilvy* in 2011. Extending the award winning campaign, a new series of PSAs were launched in 2013. Designed to reach African American and Hispanic parents, the new PSAs, entitled "Maybe," were created pro bono by Autism Speaks' lead creative agency BBDO and LatinWorks. They depict parents observing the unusual behavior or non-reaction of their child in seemingly ordinary situations. The PSAs encourage parents to ask whether "maybe" something is wrong and to seek further information about the early signs of autism and additional screening resources at autismspeaks.org/signs. The ads were created in English and Spanish for television, radio, print, outdoor and digital media.



FedEx 400 Benefiting Autism Speaks

In June, Autism Speaks roared onto the "Monster Mile" at *Dover International Speedway* for a weekend of fundraising and awareness at the "FedEx 400 Benefiting Autism Speaks" NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race. In the spirit of our partnership with *Dover International Speedway*, FedEx and the NASCAR community, more than 350 families attended the Autism Speaks Day at the Races event – a sensory friendly fan experience designed to meet the needs of children and individuals with autism. Out on the track, more than 65,000 fans cheered on *Denny Hamlin's* number 11 FedEx Toyota, which featured a special Autism Speaks puzzle piece paint scheme.

International

In its fourth year, Autism Speaks' Light It Up Blue campaign continued to raise global awareness and served as the kickoff to World Autism Awareness Day on April 2 and Autism Awareness Month. The campaign soared to new heights as over 8,400 buildings and landmarks in 101 countries and 1,335 cities on all seven continents signed on to raise unprecedented awareness of our cause. Iconic landmarks such as the Leaning Tower of Pisa in Italy, the George Washington Bridge in New York, the Halley IV Research Center in Antarctica, and the Peace Tower at the Canadian Parliament participated for the first time.



Awareness is a cornerstone of the Autism Speaks mission – with awareness comes action.

Our award winning AD Council campaign and international Light It Up Blue initiative are credited as main influencers for elevating understanding of autism in the United States and around the world.

Autism Speaks partnered with Major League Baseball (MLB)

In a league-wide effort to raise autism awareness, all 30 MLB Clubs hosted an awareness game during the 2013 season.

Many teams featured an in-stadium "quiet zone" to provide a safe, sensory friendly environment for families and individuals affected by autism. These special games were attended by more than 10,000 members of the autism community.

Sixth Annual World Focus on Autism

Autism Speaks' "Sixth Annual World Focus on Autism" brought together dignitaries from around the world to raise autism awareness. Hosted by Autism Speaks Co-founders *Suzanne and Bob Wright* and *Mrs. Ban Soon-taek*, spouse of U.N. Secretary-General *Ban Ki-moon*, the annual September event highlighted autism as a global public health issue. Attendees included *First Lady Dragica Nikolić of Serbia*; *Mrs. Datin Paduka Seri Romah Mansor*, spouse of the Prime Minister of Malaysia; Her Excellency *First Lady Mrs. Margareta Timofti*, wife of the President of the Republic of Moldova; and *Mrs. Marta Linares de Martinelli*, First Lady of Panama. *Rebecca Jarvis*, the chief financial and business correspondent at ABC News, served as master of ceremonies.

Special Events

Autism Speaks' major fundraising events raised over \$7 million in 2013. The success of these events was a result of the overwhelming support, dedication and generosity of sponsors, volunteers, in-kind donors and celebrity friends who gave their time and energy in support of our mission. Events included the **Autism Speaks to Young Professionals** series, the **15th Annual Celebrity Golf Challenge** at Winged Foot, the **4th Annual Fall Classic** golf event at Baltusrol, **Autism Speaks to Wall Street: 7th Annual Celebrity Chef Gala**, **The Winter Ball for Autism** benefitting Autism Speaks and New York Collaborates for Autism and **Speeding for a Cure** with NASCAR and *The Gillen Brewer School*.

Walk Now for Autism Speaks

Walk Now for Autism Speaks is a unique fundraising event which creates a safe and fun day for families who are affected by autism. The day includes a two- to three-mile walk and community resource fair with educational tools, therapists, recreational organizations and creative child-friendly activities. **Walk Now for Autism Speaks** is truly a "one-stop-shop" for families affected by autism. Powered by volunteers and families with loved ones on the autism spectrum, this successful grassroots fundraising effort not only generates vital funds for autism research, but also raises awareness about the increasing prevalence of autism.

Autism Speaks' signature event, *Walk Now for Autism Speaks*, along with national sponsors *Toys"R"Us* and *Babies"R"Us*, raised approximately \$30 million across 100 communities throughout the U.S. and Canada. Over 425,000 people participated in the Walks.

Team Up with Autism Speaks

Across the nation, athletes supported the autism community through **Team Up! with Autism Speaks**. They participated in marathons, triathlons, cycling and other endurance events to fundraise for families and individuals affected by autism. In 2013, **Team Up!** raised more than \$1.5 Million.

Autism Speaks U

Autism Speaks U is a program designed to support college students in their awareness, advocacy and fundraising efforts for Autism Speaks. It is an exciting and collaborative way for students to get involved with Autism Speaks and support their local autism community. Since its inaugural event at Penn State in 2006, **Autism Speaks U** events have raised over \$4 million and student-organized Walk teams have brought in millions more. In 2009, **Alpha Xi Delta Women's Fraternity** selected Autism Speaks as its national philanthropy. Since then, **Alpha Xi Deltas** across the country have worked tirelessly to promote Autism Speaks' mission by raising over \$2.5 Million.

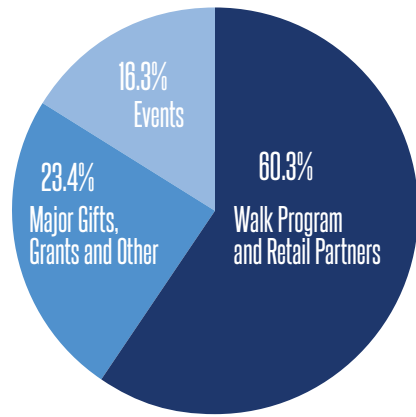

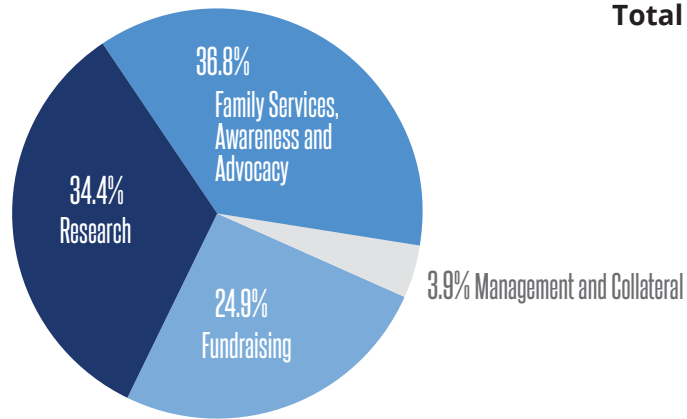
